Free EYFS Training – S.E.L.E.C.T.

Generate Teaching Hub will be running a <u>free</u>, DfE approved CPD programme for *Early Years Transition* called S.E.L.E.C.T. led by Amanda Quirk focusing upon the importance of spoken language and selfregulation in the updated EYFS statutory framework.

The sessions are ideal for teachers and teaching assistants in Reception or Year 1, as well as nurseries. They will be focused on the practical application of knowledge and led by a highly experienced EYFS consultant, sharing examples and tools for colleagues to use in the classroom; gap tasks will be set after each session by participants.



Sessions will be from 1-4pm on 9th February, 10th March, 5th April and 5th May 2022. Attendance at all sessions is ideal, a minimum of two of the sessions is required to accept a booking. To facilitate the funding of the training, all attendees will be asked to complete a short impact survey as part of the programme. The training will be held (subject to COVID restrictions) at The Peace Centre, Warrington.

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NQT+1 Training – ASPIRE

Responding to the need to support Early Career Teachers not engaged in the new Early Career Framework, <u>the ASPIRE course</u> is aimed at teachers who are in the early years of teaching (around 2-5 years) who might not necessarily be ready to undertake an NPQ at this stage, but do want to explore the possible leadership pathways available to them in the future. This is also relevant for new and early to post Middle leaders.

The <u>ASPIRE course</u> is led by experienced Senior Leaders from across The Challenge Academy Trust and is based on key principles of leadership, and as thus is accessible by all phases. The course explores the technical competencies of leadership, including literacy, SEND, conducting QA, curriculum and leading a team with impact.



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<u>All sessions</u> are on a Wednesday afternoon from 3.45-4.45pm at the Professional Development Centre, Warrington on 15th December 2021, 12th, 26th January, 9th February, 2nd, 16th, 30th March and 20th April 2022. The sessions will also be available remotely. However, they will be planned and geared towards face to face delivery. The full course is charged at the nominal fee of £50 per person

ITT Market Review

On 1st December, the DfE announced their response to the Initial Teaching Training (ITT) Market Review.

After a report was published in July, a <u>consultation was opened</u> and plans formulated from this to change the way ITT is accredited and the expectations of a Trainee teacher's year updated.

You can read the <u>plans here</u> with information on dares and DfE webinars. These new changes do not come into effect until 2024/25 but accredited providers must express interest in the tender process by 17th December 2021.

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Specialist NPQs

This term the DfE launched the revised National Professional Qualifications (NPQs) creating three specialist qualifications, **each one is now FULLY FUNDED** for state school teachers and is 12 months in length with 3 days training, online learning, coaching support and is completed with a formative assessment.

- <u>NPQ for Leading Teaching</u> For those who are, or aspire to, lead teaching in a subject, year group, key stage or phase.
- <u>NPQ for Leading Behaviour and Culture</u> For those who are, or aspire to, lead behaviour and culture and/or pupil well-being.




<u>NPQ for Leading Teacher Development</u>
For those who are, or aspire to, lead the development of other teachers, e.g. Mentor of Trainee Teachers or Early Career Teachers.

Leadership NPQs

This term the DfE revised the National Professional Qualifications (NPQs) with three reformed leadership qualifications, **each one is now FULLY FUNDED** for state school teachers and is 18 months in length with 4-6 days training, online learning, coaching support and is completed with a formative assessment.

- <u>NPQ for Senior Leadership</u> For those who are, or aspire to be, senior leaders leading across a school.
- <u>NPQ for Headship</u> For those who are, or aspire to be, Headteachers leading across a whole school (additional personalised coaching can be provided to new Headteachers).
- <u>NPQ for Executive Leadership</u> For those who are, or aspire to be, executive leaders with responsibility across more than one school.

For all NPQs apply via <u>Best Practice Network</u> before 17th December 2021 to start in March 2022, *stating Generate Teaching Hub as your provider*.



Early Career Framework

Our Early Career Framework programme began in September with over 300 teachers enrolled in local cohorts across the Hub area.



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A big thank you to all our facilitators across Halton, Warrington and Wigan who have worked hard to prepare and present the programme – using material from our national partner, *Teach First*. The new teachers and mentors who started in September will complete their first participant survey and then move onto complete module 3 in the new year.
